Official Operations Doctrine – Hercules Division

1. Purpose of This Code

The Hercules Execution Code defines **how work is performed** at Kratos Moving.

This document exists to:

- Standardize execution across all crews
- Eliminate shortcuts and improvisation
- Protect clients, property, and the company
- Define what it means to be a *Hercules*

This is not a guideline.
This is the standard.

2. What It Means to Be Hercules

Hercules is not just strong.
Hercules is a controlled **force**.

Hercules movers:

- Execute with discipline
- Follow systems, not emotions



- Respect property as if it were their own
- Represent Kratos at all times

Strength without discipline is a liability.
Discipline turns strength into trust.

3. The Core Rule of Hercules

Protect first. Move second.

No item is lifted before:

- Floors are protected
- Pathways are cleared
- Doors, corners, and tight points are identified

Speed never comes before protection.
Ever.

4. Non-Negotiable Standards (Zero Exceptions)

Every Hercules crew MUST:

- Lay floor runners immediately upon arrival
- Use shoe covers or clean footwear indoors
- Protect door jambs, walls, stairs, and elevators
- Wrap furniture properly before transport
- Follow load and weight distribution rules
- Maintain clean, organized work areas

If a standard cannot be met → **STOP and escalate to Hermes.**

5. Authority & Chain of Command

Hercules executes.

Hermes directs.

- Hermes instructions are mandatory
- Crews do not negotiate scope on-site
- Crews do not override dispatch decisions
- Sales promises do not override execution standards

If pressure arises → escalate.

Hercules does not absorb chaos.

6. Scope Discipline

Hercules moves **only what is listed.**

Hercules may NOT:

- Add items
- Remove items
- Accept “quick favors”
- Change scope verbally

Client requests outside scope must be escalated to Hermes **before action.**

This protects:

- Crews

- Dispatch
 - The company

7. Safety Is Absolute

Hercules must stop work immediately if:

- An unsafe condition exists
- An injury occurs or is suspected
- Equipment is inadequate
- Conditions exceed crew capacity

There is no punishment for stopping work due to safety.
There is punishment for ignoring risk.

8. Professional Conduct

Hercules behavior standards:

- Respectful language at all times
- No arguing with clients
- No complaining on-site
- No visible frustration
- No phone distractions

Hercules does not explain policy.
Hercules executes and escalates.

9. Equipment & Appearance

Hercules must:

- Use assigned equipment correctly
- Report missing or damaged tools immediately
- Keep trucks clean and organized
- Wear proper attire and PPE

A messy truck reflects a messy operation.

10. Pace & Efficiency

Hercules moves with:

- Purpose, not panic
- Speed, not recklessness

Rushing causes damage.
Sloppiness causes claims.

Efficiency comes from systems, not shortcuts.

11. Damage & Incident Protocol

If damage occurs or is suspected:

- Stop work
- Notify Hermes immediately
- Do not admit fault

- Do not attempt unauthorized fixes

Documentation protects everyone.

12. Accountability & Rank Impact

Hercules performance affects:

- Rank
- Pay progression
- Job priority
- Leadership trust

Consistent discipline leads to advancement.
Repeated violations lead to removal.

13. The Hercules Mindset

A Hercules understands:

- You are trusted with people's homes
 - You are judged by how you move, not how fast
 - You represent Kratos even when no one is watching
